Mastering the Art of Application of Direct Composites in Minimally Invasive Aesthetic Dentistry & Planning Complex Treatment

An attractive smile has always been a focal point of patient's attention for improving their aesthetic appearance and self esteem/image.

The evolution of composite materials today has increased the dentist's ability to control aesthetics in his own practice. This is achieved with enhanced bonding to tooth structure, predictable success and no laboratory cost.

The selection of composite materials offers a variety of shades and opacities of enamel and dentin. This is indicated for achieving natural colour and aesthetics in a relatively short, simple and predictable manner.

Most cases are accomplished with minimum tooth intervention, no local anaesthesia and at a reduced cost to the patient in one visit.

The technique can be applied to all ages. The results can be quite astounding. Patients appreciate the one visit procedure and the immediate aesthetic improvement. Dr Nalbandian's last year lecture series was most successful and attracted dental practitioners from all disciplines of dentistry. Patients are most grateful that aesthetic results are immediate and the integrity of their tooth-enamel is preserved.

The Aesthetic-Restorative Dilemma

Which is the most important - The longevity of the restoration OR the tooth that holds the restorations?

All restorations will fail in time. Preserving the enamel integrity and maintaining full control of the treatment using direct composite veneers will keep our patients smiling for a long time. Direct composites allow us to plan for the future and make appropriate changes if and when required. Why? Because smile is a fashion statement and fashion changes over a period of time!
